"In our opinion, the financial statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of the Association's affairs as at 31 July 2018 and of its surplus and cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Hong Kong Financial Reporting Standards for Private Entities and have been properly prepared in compliance with the Hong Kong Societies Ordinance."
- The balance of the Raymond James Investment Fund as of January 31, 2018 was shared and showed gain of 12.08% since inception in January 2015.

4. Strategic Directions by Stephen Dare

President Sandra Webster revisit the purposes of ACAMIS and the three major strategic directions that resulted from a Board performed strategic planning session.

ACAMIS Strategic Directions:

- 1. Student Voice and Action: Expanding the scope and form of services for students
- 2. Identity and Growth: Maintain our unique identity while we grow the organization
- 3. Professional Sharing and Learning: Expand the provision of relevant PD opportunities.

Treasurer Stephen Dare asked membership to break into small groups to discuss and present suggestions to enhance ACAMIS Strategic Directions. The following suggestions were received and will be reviewed at the next Board meeting:

- 1. ACAMIS documents to reflect student voice
- 2. More conference strands for support staffs, business managers and middle leadership
- 3. Access to expertise in child protection, both local and nationally
- 4. Align Membership standards with ACAMIS identity
- 5. Access of companies and services that ACAMIS endorses
- 6. Ways to promote school cooperation throughout the academic year

- 7. Centralize contacts and identify members; for regional members to share best practices, challenges and opportunities in China
- 8. Ways to maximize students' participations in regional activities (e.g. ACE events)
- 9. Provide access for Hong Kong schools to understand regulations in China.
- 10. Workshops for schools with diverse student population and to provide support address students within those communities.

5. Board Election:

The Election process was conducted by Vice-President Steve Moody. All member Heads were informed two weeks in advance of the AGM of three expiring terms of office and were invited to stand for election. They were also informed that all three have indicated they will stand again for election.

Three Board member terms will expire this year: President Sandra Webster, Treasurer Stephen Dare, and Board member Bill Elman who was appointed in March 2018 to fill Dr. Kate Sutton Jones' remaining term of one year. They will stand for re-election for their second three-year term.

Steve Moody asked the candidates to introduce themselves and then called on the membership to vote for the slate presented.

Election Result: The three candidates were unanimously elected to the Board for a three-year term.
